My dear brothers and sisters, I greet you! I want to tell you a bit about the people with whom we work.

Dmitri and Ann - Pray for this father and daughter!

The first is a man named **Dmitri.** He is the father of one of my students. He is an alcoholic and goes on binges that can last from two to three weeks. I talked to him a lot about the Lord and salvation, but thus far he rejects the Gospel. I invited him to our home Bible study group that I organized for young students and their parents. I was sure he would not come to the group meeting. **Then** someone knocked at the door. I opened it and saw Dmitri and his daughter, Ann. I exclaimed,

"Dmitri! I bet it will be snowing today. It is a miracle that you came!" When our meeting was over, Dmitri and Ann left the apartment, but two minutes later they came back. I saw snow on Dmitri's shoulders. I was shocked to see it. He said that I told him about snow. I said it was a sign from God, and Dmitri had to believe. Dmitri attended two more meetings in the group, and then he stopped coming. Please pray for his salvation.

As for Ann, she confessed her sins at our sports camp last year. She wanted to abandon the habit of filthy communication most of all. She was eight years old then. It was the influence of her parents. Even at her young age, Ann drank alcohol (also the example of her parents) and smoked. After her confession, she stopped filthy communications and doing other bad things. It is hard to say if she is

born again, although I can say that God is working with her and continues to work. Ann also told me that she stopped using filthiness. She can hardly stay indifferent when her parents say bad words.

Once, while traveling with her father in a car, she asked him to switch off the songs with bad words, that he was listening to. Ann asked him to stop listening to such songs. Now he does not listen to such songs in the car when Ann is with him. Ann's mother warned her that she would stop allowing Ann to attend the lessons if she did not stop reminding her about the use of bad words.

Konstantin – A battle over this young soul!

I am happy about a boy named Konstantin. He is age 11. He turned to God in the camp last year. He began to read the Bible with interest right after that. He told me several times that he wanted to be a disciple of Christ (I saw tears in his eyes). At the beginning of a new school year, I noticed that something had happened to him. The expression of

his eyes changed. The look was angry. When I read Scripture before the lessons, he did not listen and something distracted him. He was aggressive and proud. Then I found out that he began to smoke.

It turned out that he had become acquainted with local young hooligans. Strangely, when Konstantin's parents found out that he had begun to smoke, they forbade him to attend our lessons! I talked to them, but nothing changed. I began to pray for him specifically.

Then at our sports camp in June, Konstantin asked to talk with me. He said he wanted to repent. I asked him why he wanted to do it. He said his sins tormented him. He prayed and I prayed for

him. The next day, Konstantin told his young group leader in the camp that he had gotten rid of the songs with filthy music on his phone. On the second day in the camp, my student Sofia repented, then Konstantin turned to God. The same evening, Anastasia (the mother of a student) heard the Gospel and repented the same day, asking God to forgive her sins. The next day, other pupils began to turn to God. Nine pupils out of 12 repented. Glory be to our Lord Jesus Christ!

Please, pray that God will keep these children, that they will become His disciples, and that more children will come with the beginning of a new school year.

Katya realized and understood that no matter how difficult it was on this path, it was necessary to walk with hope in God, and to remain faithful to Him until the end. After all, the Lord God, as the Bible says, gives each Christian the tests of faith according to his strength, so that it is possible to endure everything. Thus, Ekaterina determined to fulfill God's will to the end, no matter what happens, to make a covenant with the Lord through water baptism.

When this covenant day came during her preparation for baptism, Ekaterina had to go through some difficulties with her family, both on the part of her unbelieving husband, as well as the young children. Thank God that He helped in all this, even saving the life and health of one of the children.

On this appointed solemn feast day, Ekaterina made a covenant with the Lord, receiving water baptism, and promising God to serve in good conscience. My dear brothers and sisters, friends, please support me and the church in praying to God for Ekaterina, so that the Lord may strengthen her first of all spiritually, but also physically, in all circumstances to live in hope and trust in the Lord."

Nothing is impossible for God, and He can use even the opposition of His enemies to spread the Gospel even farther! •

We now have more children in our church than adults! So many come from unbelieving families to the church. We always try to feed them and tell them about God.

The children proved to be very difficult—there were three kids who were completely out of control. At first, we even wanted to send them home from the camp because of their behavior, but God touched one of these three. Young

Maxim had reflected on his behavior. The Bible class he had been in was teaching about the meaning of life, why we appeared on this earth, why we live, and where we will go after leaving this earth. Maxim began to ask Alexander questions, and even started to talk about it

with his friends who were misbehaving. All three boys began to think about it. In the end Maxim repented. Thank God!

In July, the church held another Bible school. The team who conducted it lovingly carried out children's ministry. I saw them come together in the evening hours to pray. They asked God to help them and enable them to better present the Gospel to the children's hearts.

This is a very difficult labor. Several times they invited me to pray and I prayed with them. I am very thankful to God that He prepared such great people. The guys were not only from our church, but also three brothers from Golgotha Baptist Church in Minsk. They are working sacrificially for God. I saw that the adults, elderly, and youth are needed as an important part for the ministry in the church.

During the camp, I saw how united all the church members were. People constantly asked me how they could help and participate in the children's ministry. I thank God that people in the church love God and each other. I am very grateful to God that you are praying for me, my family, for my wife Tatiana, and for all our ministry.

Please pray that we will have funds to build a playground for the children's ministry. We also pray for you and your ministry and thank you for your prayer support. •



The ways are so varied. Some are able to engage in larger evangelistic events, while others are in regions where ministry has to be carried out far more discreetly. They share Christ one-on-one. They share Christ in hospitals, nursing homes, and even prisons. They organize sports ministries to reach youth and young adults with the Gospel. They hold summer camp

ministries with all the usual activities for children in addition to Bible lessons. Some are in areas where they can hold an activity like rafting down a river, all while witnessing for Christ and modeling His example during the trip.

There are regions of Russia where the climate and terrain are very difficult, including bitterly cold temperatures that last for weeks. That won't stop the pastors and evangelists. The only access to some of the villages is by riverboat or by driving up a frozen riverbed in the winter. Even on snowmobiles! Christmas will be here before we know it, and by God's grace, thousands of children will be reached with the Gospel as they receive Christmas gifts you help provide.

I truly pray and hope that as you read, you will get a sense of the eternal impact of what is happening. Thank you as always for your faithful partnership in helping to make it all happen!
